As well as exploring local wildlife and ways to support it, **student wellbeing** proved a huge focus for the Green Influencers at Woodland Primary and made this the focus of their Green Influencer Project.



CLOUDS

Students built and designed a cloud watching bed to promote mental wellbeing, as well as creating a 'positive-tree' as place to regain perspective



BUG HUNT

Students used drop sheets and ID charts to survey and record the insects and arachnids they found around the school grounds



AWARDS

All students achieved the RSPB Schools Wild Challenge Bronze Award for their contribution to helping wildlife and habitats, plus their Green Influencer certificate



SHOPPING

Students helped compile a shopping list of resources and gathered what they could from home and onsite to repurpose in the project
